1. Private Housing

Prices for a private room in a shared apartment range from € 350.00 to € 550.00 (or higher) per month. Please note you will also be required to pay a deposit of one to three months' rent when you sign the contract. Always ask for a signed receipt of payment.

Please note: DO NOT make any payments from abroad in advance. Make sure to meet with the person who is providing the accommodation when you arrive in Rome before making any payments. If you have any doubts do not hesitate to contact the Hello Office for advice.

Here below some additional details are provided for room or apartments currently available, located close to the University.

Apartment 1: Via Lago di Lesina n. 57 (Close to Metro B/Annibaliano Station) . Apartment located on the 5th floor, consisting of with 6 bedrooms, 3 bathrooms, kitchen, two large terraces. Rentable from October for three single rooms. Cost € 520 including condo fees, heating, water are charged to the owner.

Apartment 2: Via delle Isole Curzolane n. 16. (Close to Metro B/Ionio Station) Apartment located at the 2nd floor, consisting of 3 bedrooms, 2 with balcony, bathroom, kitchen available from October. Cost € 420, € 400 and € 380 depending on the size of the rooms. The fee is inclusive of the cost of building and water consumption, heating costs are excluded .

Apartment 3: Via Enrico Cialdini n. 14, Termini area. Apartment on the 3rd floor consisting of 3 single rooms, bathroom and kitchen. Cost € 500, € 450 depending on the size of the rooms. The fee is inclusive of service charges and water consumption.

Apartments 4 and 5:

- A studio apartment consisting of kitchen, bedroom, bathroom and loft, suitable for 2 people at a cost of € 450.00 per person, including expenses (electricity, water, gas, heating, garbage, internet, concierge services;

- An apartment with 2 doubles and a single with 2 bathrooms, kitchen and balcony with a large entrance.

€ 375.00 is the cost of the bed in a double room, including expenses;

€ 540.00 is the cost of a single room, including expenses

All are at 10-minute walking from the University "La Sapienza" in the San Lorenzo district. In front of the building there is the tram stop of line No. 2, 3 and 19. At 4-minute tram ride there is the Metro B, "Policlinico" stop. Ten meters away is the supermarket, pizzeria, bar, newsagent, the copy shop, post offices, banks and other essential services.

The apartments are completely renovated with new furniture. Home furnishings are made available to the tenants as well as the utensils and dishes, too: blankets, bedspreads, sheets, pillows, towels.

A bed for the male, € 375.00.

2. Housing Facilities coordinated by Sapienza

Sapienza periodically issues a new call to identify housing for university students through agreements with agencies and individual house owners. Housing obtained through special agreements is reserved for:

- Students enrolled at Sapienza
- Students about to take a Sapienza entrance examination
- **Foreign students participating in academic, didactic and cultural exchanges with Sapienza**

Interested students should contact the structures directly. All Sapienza housing agreements include an official contract, free intermediation services, quality standards and guarantee the conformity and safety of housing.

3. Newspapers

There are a lot of newspapers distributed free of charge near news-stands, in front of bars, pubs, etc. which publish accommodation offers. Be aware that they only have adverts from real-estate agencies that charge at least one month's rent + VAT for their service and prefer renting apartments to long term students studying in Rome who have already studied here for a few years.

A local classifieds paper for announcements of rooms for rent through a real estate agency or directly from the landlord is Porta Portese. It comes out on Tuesdays and Fridays.

4. Room Adverts on University Notice Boards/Word of Mouth
